USGA RULES AND DECISIONS, DESIGNATED LOCAL RULES FROM APPENDIX 1 IN THE USGA RULES, AND THE FOLLOWING LOCAL RULES GOVERN ALL PLAY.

- 1. A water hazard on #1 and a water hazard on #18 both cross the fairway and are marked with yellow stakes and/or lines. All lakes are played as lateral water hazards and are marked with red stakes and/or lines. Two ball drop zones are provided on #4 as an additional option for a ball in the lateral water hazard. A player who chooses to use the ball drop on #4 must use the drop zone nearer to where the ball last crossed the margin of the lateral water hazard. Rule 26.
- 2. The Bullard Wash to the left of #10, #11, #17, and #18 is deemed to be an environmentally sensitive lateral water hazard and is designated by red stakes with green tops and red lines. A ball must not be played from the environmentally sensitive area. For a ball known or virtually certain to be in the environmenshown or virtually certain to be in the environmentally sensitive area, the player must take relief as a lateral water hazard under Rule 26. A ball drop zone is provided behind the green on #17 as an additional option for a ball in the environmentally sensitive lateral water hazard to the left of the green. The water hazard to the left of the green. The water hazard to the left of the green. that crosses #18 is marked with yellow stakes and/or lines and is not deemed to be an environmentally sensitive area. A player may not stand in the environmentally sensitive area to play a ball that is not in the environmentally sensitive area and must drop, without penalty, within one club length of the nearest point of relief that would eliminate standing in the environmentally sensitive area.
- 3. Out of bounds is marked by white stakes, retaining walls, curbs of streets, and homeowner property lines typically evidenced by a change in the landscape rock. Any ball that goes into or crosses a street is out of bounds. Rule 27.
- 4. Ground under repair is encircled with white paint. French drains, drainage areas filled with large rocks, and the cactus garden in the desert area to the right of

- #18 are played as ground under repair even though not marked. Rule 25.
- Stones in bunkers are deemed to be movable obstructions and Rule 24-1 applies. The rock landscaped area within the path at the cart turnaround behind #18 green is deemed to be part of the cart path and players may take relief without penalty under Rule 24-2.
- The stone-blocked tree wells on the left side of #15 are deemed to be integral parts of the course and relief without penalty is not provided.
- The embedded ball rule is in effect anywhere "through the green," except in loose sand. See Appendix 1 in the USGA Rules.
- Some young trees are staked for protection. The Local Rule in Appendix 1 in the USGA Rules is in effect.



- 5. Please fill divots with sand and seed mix, repair ball marks, and rake bunkers.
- 6. All vardages are measured to the middle of the green.
