

COVID-19 Update – Nov. 16, 2020

Members of the HOA Board and our management staff have noted an increase in the number of positive COVID-19 cases that are being attributed to residents within the community. We are hearing from a number of different resources; often it is someone notifying us that an individual(s) from their circle is reporting a positive test status. This increase in cases is not a surprise, as numbers are up throughout our state and across many states in the country.

The HOA remains committed to doing whatever possible to protect and maintain the health of all PebbleCreek residents. Masks are still required in all HOA facilities, and can be removed in some cases as noted in those locations. In addition, we continue to ask that you maintain at least six-feet of social distance when possible.

The HOA staff has not been exempt from the virus, recently we have had a few reporting positive which was posted on the website and is on the COVID-19 page. Thankfully, these employees are all in jobs that have little or no direct contact with homeowners. In all cases these individuals are self-quarantining and reported immediately. All HOA Staff complete a health screening prior to every shift, wear masks and regularly sanitize their work areas.

Because numbers are on the rise, the HOA Board stands firm that places like meeting rooms, our Theater and other locations where indoor gathering occurs will remain closed for use until further notice.

Please do what you can to keep yourself, your neighbors and everyone in PebbleCreek safe by following CDC guidelines of wearing a mask, washing your hands frequently and minimizing contact with others whenever possible.
